For nearly half a century the work of rebuilding the parish churches after the Great Fire of London was directed by Sir Christopher Wren, whose buildings mirrored the theology of his day, the Church of England as a reformed Catholic Church.

In a City being rebuilt in record time around him, Wren favoured plain glass to let light flood into his buildings, but after WWII a remarkable generation of artists emerged who used colour to tell the churches stories to a post war world

As part of St Lawrence Jewry's Diamond Jubilee celebrations, City Guides and Lecturers Alexandra Epps and Jill Finch will be **WREN WATCHING** here on May 23rd.

In the *morning* they will look in depth at the history and stained glass of St Lawrence Jewry and in the *afternoon* they will be leading a walk from Guildhall Yard taking in 3 other Wren churches, discussing Wren, stained glass, the City churches and their history.
