Once again there is a rich variety of events taking place in the City churches during the coming month. Arguably each one of them is of interest but inevitably several seem to stand out and attract one's attention. At **St Michael Paternoster Royal** a Matinée Charity concert is to be held on Thursday 28th September. The charity is *The Mission to Seafarers*, the offices of which are situated at the church itself. Piracy, shipwreck, abandonment and separation from loved ones are just a few of the problems merchant seafarers face. The Mission, with its global network of chaplains, staff and volunteers provides practical help and support around the world to the 1.5 million men and women who face danger every day to keep our global economy afloat. The Mission had its beginning in 1836 when the Revd John Ashley established the Bristol Channel Mission as a result of seeing the loneliness and spiritual needs of merchant seafarers at anchor. Following his example a number of Anglican ministries established similar missions and in 1856 it was decided to establish a single organisation - The Mission to Seamen - as it was known - was made a missionary society of the Anglican Communion and its work grew in line with the rapidly expanding British maritime empire. In 2000 the name was changed to reflect its role as a society which cares for all seafarers, regardless of gender. The Charity Concert will feature the international concert pianist Phillip Dyson, renowned for his unique abilities in both the classical and light music repertoire. His programme reflects that with pieces by Beethoven, Schubert, Rachmaninov, Liszt, Chopin, Scott Joplin and George Gershwin. Fuller details of this most worthwhile event are given at the date, [Thursday 28th September](#).

Earlier in same week another noteworthy charity event will be taking place - [The Lord Mayor's Giving Day on Tuesday 26th September](#). A most unique event on that day will be the *The Long Long Lunch* starting in **St Stephen Walbrook** and continuing with sumptuous dining at a long, long table down St Swithin's Lane nearby. Also, during the day there will be fundraising activities in the churchyard of **St Mary le Bow**. More details and internet links concerning the day and its aims are to be found at the date quoted.

At **St George's German Lutheran Church** on [Wednesday 27th September](#) in the evening, under the auspices of the organisation *Huguenots of Spitalfields*, there is to be given a talk by Peter Guillery on the journeymen weavers' houses of Spitalfields. This will be a fascinating event associated with this historical area of the east end of London and, it must be added, because of the venue. Again, more details are given at the date in the following pages.

Returning to the musical events taking place in City churches, on [Tuesday 5th September](#) an unusual lunchtime organ recital will be given by Daniel Moulton and Catherine Ennis at **St Lawrence Jewry** featuring music for two organs, the arrangements having been made by the organists themselves. Composers featured include Richard Strauss, Handel, Wagner, Grainger and Antonio Soler. This promises to be a most entertaining occasion.

One of the most loved settings of the Requiem, that by Fauré, will be featured on two occasions. First there will be the Brandenburg Festival 'Come and Sing' workshop at **The Gresham Centre at St Anne & St Agnes** on [Sunday 10th September](#). Then later in the month, on [Friday 22nd September](#), again under the auspices of the Brandenburg Festival, at **St Katharine Cree**, this lovely work will be performed by the Fisher Consort. Finally mention must be made of the resumption of lunchtime recitals and concerts under the auspices of the City Music Society at **St Bartholomew the Great** on [Friday 22nd and 29th September](#). The programmes contain excellent works and these augur well for this noteworthy series of concerts.

As always the City churches will be fulfilling their primary mission together with the provision of excellent performances of sublime music in unique surroundings.

The houses of Georgian Spitalfields might seem well known. However, alongside the silk-merchants' houses that currently line the streets, there were also tenements and cottages for the weavers of the vital silk industry of Spitalfields. Few of these humble dwellings survive.

In this talk, Peter Guillery reconstructs the character of this forgotten Georgian Spitalfields.

St George's German Lutheran Church is owned by the Historic Chapels Trust. St George's is the oldest surviving German Church in the British Isles, opened in 1752. Today only the church and its former school adjacent are left to remind us of this huge refugee population in an area once called 'Little Germany'.
